Guiding questions and knowledge of animals to facilitate and deepen tracking

Consider what's true in general as well as seasonal and individual variations.

Elements: Examples: Deer: Bobcat: Coyote: owls ~ eyes, dogs ~ nose Sensory Dominance, primary ears eyes nose

Sensory Dominance, secondary

Body Configuration, qualitative:

rabbits ~ airy, otters ~ dense density

fat stores shrews ~ skinny

weight distribution raccoons ~ weight on hind

Body Configuration, quantitative:

weight

length, head+body voles ~ 4.5"

length, tail voles ~ 2"

height field marks

foot morphology raccoons ~ plantigrade

gaits

Pushes away Draws in

Threatened by coyotes ~ cougars

Travel patterns foxes ~ edges

Territorial marks (secretions, scratches, sounds) raccoons ~ latrines

Foods (generally, specifically) moles ~ earthworms Shelters (burrows, dens, cavities, lays) deer ~ lays, beds

Population limits raccoons ~ # hollow logs
